SHORNCLIFFE LAKE PARK BYLAWS

CAMPING

- 1. Entrance gates will be closed between 11 pm and 6 am.
- 2. Quiet hours will be observed from 11 pm until 6 am. No objectionable disturbance or unreasonable noise will be allowed at any time.
- 3. No glass beverage containers are allowed in the park.
- 4. Overnight camping is only allowed in the campground area, or upon the premises of a leased lot provided the presence of a tent or recreational vehicle upon same does not pose an unreasonable obstruction or hazard, to be determined by the landlord or his designate at their sole discretion.
- 5. A camping permit is required for overnight camping in all campsites and for any camping units in leased lots (1 small tent per permit will be included).
- 6. All campers must register and obtain a camping permit. These permits are non-transferable and nonrefundable.
- 7. The permit holder is responsible for all actions of visitors and camping party members in the campsite.
- 8. All campsites are on a first-come, first-served basis with the exception of pre-booked family reunions.
- 9. Only one recreation vehicle per campsite or leased lot is allowed unless other arrangements are made.
- 10. Campers may stay for a maximum of 14 consecutive days in one allotted campsite. If staying longer campers must move to another site, unless permission is granted by the landlord or his designate.
- 11. Visitor's vehicles should be parked in designated parking areas if they must leave the campground after 11 pm.
- 12. Tents are only allowed in designated areas.
- 13. Campfires are permitted only in the facilities provided for that purpose. Campers must ensure that all fires are extinguished before leaving.
- 14. No person shall operate an Off-Highway vehicle in the Park.
- 15. Individuals who cannot provide camping status may be asked to leave.

GENERAL

- 1. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times.
- 2. Cutting, defacing or removing park property or any plant, fossil or rock is prohibited.
- 3. Feeding or harassing wild animals is prohibited.
- 4. Liquor is allowed only within a camper's registered campsite. If a camper is found in possession of liquor in washrooms, camp kitchens, roads, beaches, picnic or other public areas, they will be subject to prosecution under the Alberta Liquor Act.
