

BYLAW NO. 2337

Bylaw No. 2337 of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52 in the Province of Alberta, shall be known as the Noise Bylaw.

A Bylaw of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52 being a bylaw for the purpose of prohibiting, eliminating or abating noise in designated areas of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52.

UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY conferred upon it by the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26, Section 7 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000 and amendment thereto, the Council of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52 enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw,
 - a) "Designated area" means an area within a Hamlet, Shorncliffe Lake, or Capt. Ayre Lake.
 - a) "day" means the period between 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. of the same day.
 - b) "night" means the period between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. of the following day.
 - c) "M.D." means the Municipal District of Provost No. 52.
 - d) "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52 and whatever subsequent title may be conferred by Council or Statute.
 - e) "Peace Officer" means a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, member of the enforcement division of Alberta Transportation, a Wildlife Officer appointed under the Wildlife Act or Bylaw Enforcements Officer of the Municipal District of Provost No. 52
 - h) "person" includes a corporation and the heirs, executors, administrators or other legal representatives of a person.
 - i) "noise" means any loud sound, however produced, and includes the sound of human voices, sounds emitted by any machinery or equipment or radio or television or musical instrument or any other apparatus which produces sound, which is likely to disturb someone.
2. No person shall, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., while in a designated area, make or cause to be made or permit to make any noise of such a volume that noise can be easily heard by a person who is within the boundaries of the same designated area in which the noise is occurring.
3. The Administrator may issue a permit to a person for the purpose of allowing such person to cause a noise within the M.D., but such permit shall state the dates and hours during which such noise may occur.
4. Sections 2 and 3 of this bylaw do not apply to any noise caused by the M.D., its agents, or its employees while carrying out the instructions of the M.D.
5. Any person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine in the sum of:

a) A minimum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), for a first offence, exclusive of costs and

b) A minimum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for a second and subsequent offence, exclusive of costs.

6. If the fine specified on an offence ticket is not paid within the prescribed time period, then a peace officer is hereby authorized and empowered to lay a complaint and issue a summons by means of a violation ticket pursuant to Part II of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. P-34.

7. The violation ticket shall be in the form prescribed by Part II of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. P-34.
